Description:

This year, toxic waste generation at Andijan State Institute of Foreign Languages remained minimal because the institute does not operate chemical-intensive laboratories or industrial facilities. The toxic waste produced on campus was limited to small quantities of used batteries, fluorescent lamps, energy-saving bulbs, printer cartridges, and minor electronic waste generated through routine educational, administrative, and maintenance activities.

According to the collected data, the institute produced 0.05 tons of toxic waste this year, which is lower than the 0.10 tons produced last year. This shows a reduction of 0.05 tons during the reporting period. No laboratory chemical waste was produced, as the institute's academic activities are not related to chemical or industrial processes.

All toxic waste materials are collected separately from general waste and stored in designated areas before being handled through appropriate disposal practices. Reusable or recyclable electronic items, cartridges, and other minor hazardous materials are prepared for safe transfer or further treatment where applicable. These measures help prevent unsafe disposal, reduce environmental risks, and support responsible toxic waste management on campus.

This activity supports SDG 12 – Responsible Consumption and Production by promoting safe handling, separation, and responsible disposal of hazardous materials. It also contributes to SDG 13 –



Climate Action by reducing environmental risks related to toxic waste and supports SDG 11 – Sustainable Cities and Communities by helping maintain a cleaner, safer, and more sustainable campus environment.
